Bayfield bus stop for Bustang Outrider: Bustang Outrider is adding Bayfield to its Durango – Grand Junction route, providing another transit option for people in the Pine River Valley area.

Outrider's new stop is at the Pine River Library, 395 Bayfield Center Dr. The bus departs <u>Bayfield daily at 6:10 am., arriving in Durango at 6:32 am</u>. Return trips leave the <u>Durango Transit Center at 7:10 pm., arriving in Bayfield at 7:30 pm.</u> The fare is \$4, with discounts available for those 65 years and older, 2 to 11 years old and disabled individuals. Those under 2 years old ride for free. Passengers paying the driver

must use cash and have the exact fare amount. Otherwise, tickets can be purchased on the Bustang Outrider App.

"The addition of the Bayfield stop is a great enhancement to the Bustang Outrider Service. This stop provides a convenient transportation option for commuters travelling to Durango for work, school, or medical appointments. It also provides a safe, convenient, and critical regional transit connection for travel from Bayfield to Cortez, Telluride, and Grand Junction," said Amber Blake, the director of the Colorado Department of Transportation's Division of Transit and Rail. "From Grand Junction, riders are able to travel across the state, connecting to the mainline Bustang service with connections to Glenwood Springs, Vail, and Denver."

Bustang Outrider vehicles are equipped with Wi-Fi, power outlets, a restroom, storage areas, and bike racks.

Bustang Outrider is a subsidiary of CDOT's Bustang service that offers statewide bus connections, Outrider works with local bus services in rural areas to ensure Coloradans get reliable buses, updated schedules, convenient connections and consistent fares. Do you own a house? Do you own a structure or an impermeable surface? Does your Homeowners Association have a detention/retention pond?

If any are true, than yes you are responsible for stormwater management. You may wonder why the Town is not managing stormwater. The answer to that question is that older developments were built before there were regulations or a developer went bankrupt and newer developments were built with a promise that all property owners would participate in managing their stormwater. Bayfield, in the future, could decide to ask voters if they want to pay for town-wide stormwater management. For now each property owner is responsible either to manage their stormwater or support their homeowners association to manage associated stormwater.

Town staff will be creating a "Best Management Practice" document later this year to assist all property owners and associations to better manage stormwater
