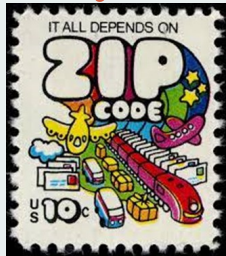

Introduced in 1963 with five digits, a ZIP Code, is a basic format used by the USPS to expedite mail delivery. In 1983, an extended ZIP+4 code was introduced; it included the five digits of the ZIP Code, followed by a hyphen and four digits that designated a more specific location.

PUBLIC INPUT



The public is always welcome to attend town meetings and observe or become involved. Written input is also welcome before or after meetings. Here are a couple hints.

⇒ The customary request for name and address, however everybody regardless of where they live should feel welcome to participate.

⇒ All meeting agendas are posted a minimum of 24-hours in advance on the west door of Town Hall, 1199 Bayfield Parkway. Additional information is available on the town website.

⇒ Regular Board of Trustee meetings are the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month at 6:30pm.

⇒ Planning Commission meetings are the 2nd Tuesday of the month at 6:30pm.

⇒ Each meeting agenda has a time set aside to for public input that is not associated with an agenda item.

⇒ It is common for citizens to have questions regarding the Town. Contact town hall and the receptionist will attempt to answer or forward you to the appropriate staff member. If you have a question for the Board of Trustees or the Planning Commission it is helpful to provide the question in writing. Each question may require either time to place on an agenda or town staff may reply sooner. Based on statutory requirements not all questions can be answered immediately by the Board of Trustees or Planning Commission when the issue associated with the question is not on the agenda.

⇒ In the event the public would like to provide input or ask questions on an agenda item the leader of the meeting will announce the item and all are invited to speak.

⇒ Questions by the public for an item on an agenda are usually answered during a meeting by town staff, town attorney, the applicant if applicable or members of the Board of Trustees or Planning Commission if it falls within their official role.

If this all seems overcomplicated, call Town Manager Katie Sickles 970-884-9544 Ext 101 and she will schedule time at town hall or will meet you for coffee.

Zucchini Bread—Phyllis Ludwig

- 3 eggs
- 1 cup cooking oil
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 2 to 2 1/2 cups grated zucchini
- 1 to 1 1/2 cups chopped nuts
- 3 1/4 cups flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 3 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 tsp. salt

Beat together eggs, oil, sugar and vanilla. Add zucchini, flour, baking powder, soda, cinnamon and salt. Stir well. Add nuts to mixture. Bake in loaf pan(s) at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Cool 10 minutes. Remove from pans. Makes 2 loaves.

Shredded Zucchini Quiche—Jean Elliott

- 1 unbaked 9" pastry shell
- 1 tbsp. butter
- 1/4 cup wheat germ (optional)
- 1/2 cup shredded Swiss cheese
- 1/4 cup chopped green onions
- 2 small zucchini, coarsely shredded
- 1/2 cup shredded jack cheese
- 3 eggs
- 1 tbsp. flour
- 1 1/2 cup light cream
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 3/4 tsp. pepper

Bake unpricked pastry shell in a 450 degree oven for only 5 minutes. Remove pastry shell and reduce oven temperature to 325 degrees. Generously spread butter over bottom and sides of the pastry shell, then sprinkle with wheat germ if desired. Top with a layer of the Swiss cheese, followed by onion, zucchini and jack cheese. In bowl, beat eggs, flour, light cream, salt, and pepper together and pour over the other ingredients in the pastry shell.

Return pie to oven and continue baking at 325 degrees for 35 – 40 minutes until knife inserted just off-center comes out clean.

CDOT Multimodal Options Funds (MMOF) Grant

In May, 2022 the Town of Bayfield applied for the CDOT MMOF Grant to do preliminary engineering and a pedestrian survey for a potential Highway 160 pedestrian crossing at the intersection of North Commerce Drive. The Town is pleased to announce that we were awarded \$30,000 from CDOT for this project. The project will kick-off in August once school is back in session to get accurate pedestrian crossing counts.

CDOT Revitalizing Main Streets Grant

On Tuesday, July 19th, the Board of Trustees approved Resolution 530 authorizing Town staff to apply for the CDOT Revitalizing Main Streets Grant. If received, this grant will be used to help complete sidewalk improvements for the east side of Mill Street. The plan is to eventually replace all the sidewalks along Mill Street with wider sidewalks.
