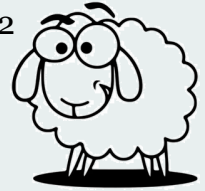

BAYFIELD MARSHAL'S OFFICE

- ⇒ The Bayfield Marshals are available 24/7, 365 days a year.
- ⇒ If the office is closed and you need to talk to a Deputy you can call Dispatch at 970-385-2900
- ⇒ If you call the office number 970-884-9636 after hours, a recording states, "If you need to talk to a Deputy, to file a complaint, have a question or concern press 1," and it forwards the call to Dispatch then to a Deputy on duty.
- ⇒ After hours contact information is posted on the office door.

WHAT IS WRONG WITH THIS PICTURE!

These carts are too close together. Please leave at least 3 feet separation between poly carts for trash collection. This allows the driver to empty the containers independently without knocking over the next cart. Trash left outside of the container will not be picked up. Avoid over filling your container. An overfilled container is difficult to empty and can cause trash to be deposited outside of the garbage truck. Keep the latch free of debris and completely close the lid until it latches to secure trash inside. As always thank you for your cooperation Bayfield Public Works.

Stormwater Public Meeting

The Town of Bayfield will be hosting a stormwater public meeting on Monday, October 17, 2022 at Town Hall at 6:00 pm. Town staff will be presenting some “Best Management” practices when it comes to Homeowner Associations and homeowner responsibilities pertaining to stormwater. Town staff will be available to answer questions about Bayfield’s current stormwater facilities, how they should be maintained, and seek public input on how maintenance should be paid for in the future.

HB21-1271 Affordable Housing Infrastructure Funding

On Tuesday, August 16th, the Board of Trustees approved Resolution 534 supporting the Town of Bayfield’s Letter of Interest to apply for affordable housing infrastructure funding from HB21-1271. This will cover the cost for the infrastructure, landscaping and tap (PIF) fees for the Cinnamon Heights (Lots 12-41) Deed Restricted project.

2023 Colorado Water Plan <https://engagewcb.org/comment-on-the-draft-2023-colorado-water-plan>

The 2023 Colorado Water Plan is available for public review and comment until September 30, 2022. The Plan will be finalized in January, 2023. “The 2023 plan incorporates state-of-the-art tools and data that takes into account climate change, population growth, scenario planning, drought resilience and funding opportunities for the water community to take action. It also focuses on the importance of embracing equity, diversity and inclusion as we partner to be more resilient.” The Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB) has three different ways for Coloradans to get involved with the Colorado Water Plan during the public comment period until September 30th: 1) Comment on the Water Plan draft by identifying requested changes or improvements to a specific chapter, page, or action. 2) Commit to taking action by taking the Water ‘22 Pledge or getting involved with local water issues. 3) Share your water success story, such as something you have done to help make Colorado more drought resilient by taking action in your city, on your farm or in your watershed.
