Winter is on the way!

It's time to get ready for colder weather at home and in your car.

- * Winterize irrigation systems to prevent breakage and water leaks in the spring.
- * Clean vents and stovepipes.
- * Check weather stripping around doors and windows.
- * Check vehicle tires for wear, including the spare, make sure wiper blades are not cracked, and check fluids and brakes.
- * Keep an emergency kit in each vehicle. National Safety Council recommends:
 - ◇ Jumper cables
 - ◇ Tool kit or multipurpose tool
 - ◇ Flashlight and extra batteries
 - ◇ Reflective triangles
 - ◇ First aid kit and blankets
 - ◇ Nonperishable, high-energy foods and drinking water
 - ◇ Car charger for your cell phone
 - ◇ Fire extinguisher
 - ◇ Snow brush, shovel, cat litter or chains for traction
