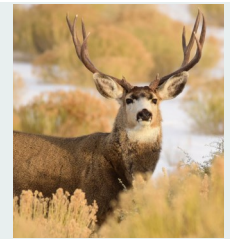

Upper Pine River Fire Protection District staff held a *First on the Scene* class at Pine River Senior Center November 29th. Approximately a dozen participants learned how to perform hands-only CPR and use an automated external defibrillator machine (AED), epi-pen administration, wound and tourniquet application, patient movement depending on situation, and when to administer Narcan to a person who may have a suspected opioid overdose.

New utility rates in effect January 1, 2023

New Town of Bayfield utility rates were adopted by Town Board of Trustees December 6, 2022, via **Resolution 552** and go into effect January 1, 2023. Water and sewer customers can expect to see the new rates reflected in bills for January's usage.

In Town Rates

Mosquito Spray \$1.38 per month

Water Residential Base \$34.87 for 6,000 gallons

Garbage Collection \$13.15 per month 1st cart

Sewer Residential Base \$65.45

Out of Town Rates

Water Residential Base \$52.30

Sewer Residential Base \$93.50

Town adopts policy regarding banners at Eight Corners

Banners will be regulated at US 160, US 160C, Bayfield Parkway and Buck Highway Intersection, locally known as Eight Corners in reference to several intersecting travel ways. Historically this prominent location has attracted banners for the purpose to advertise local events and programs. Resolution 549 was adopted to regulate hanging of banners to reduce sign pollution and driver distraction. The Board of Trustees discussed the matter and determined that this regulation does not go far enough and that continued abuse of sign and banners posted all over town could be prohibited in all town right-of-ways. Joe Stephenson Park plan revised

During the 2018 Master Plan process, plans involved moving the rodeo arena to a larger area south of the Town's Wastewater Treatment Plant and expanding amenities at Joe Stephenson Park. After further investigation, using the arena to expand Joe Stephenson Park was not possible. The Town has contracted with the original Master Plan consultant to revise the plan.
