Vacation Rentals/Short-Term Rentals



Vacation Rentals/ Short-Term Rentals are allowed within Town of Bayfield limits a use by review public hearing before

the Planning Commission, and they cannot be within 500-feet of another approved Vacation Rental. A Vacation Rental is also required to get an annual business license. Some Homeowner Associations do not allow Vacation Rentals, and the Town will respect those Codes, Covenants and Restrictions. If you are operating a Vacation Rental without Town approval or an active Business License, you are considered an illegal use and the Town can take enforcement action against you.
